Trevor Burke graduated at Queens University Belfast, and, following appointments in Belfast and Manchester, he worked in general dental practice from 1975 to 1996 in Manchester, also working 1.5 days per week in the Unit of Restorative Dentistry at the University of Manchester. He moved to his present position as Professor of Primary Dental Care at the University of Birmingham and Hon. Consultant in Restorative Dentistry in 2000.

Trevor is (co-) author of 290 papers published in peer-reviewed journals and three books. His principal interests are in the translation of in vitro research on dental materials into the clinical situation. In this regard, he co-ordinates the work of two practice-based research groups (The PREP Panel, with 33 dentists UK-wide and BRIDGE, a West Midlands group with 18 dentists) who carry out clinical evaluations of a variety of materials. He is Chair of the Practice-based Research Network of the IADR. Trevor has been Programme Director of a Masters course in Advanced General Dental Practice for 13 years, this being part time to suit the busy lives of dental practitioners. A Distance version of the course commenced in Feb.2013. Trevor is also Editorial Director of Dental Update and is Chair of the Board of Dental Protection.

Louis McKenzie

Louis qualified from Birmingham in 1990 and has worked as an associate at the Selly Park dental centre in Birmingham ever since.

He was appointed as a part-time clinical lecturer at the school of dentistry in 2004.

He designs and develops e-learning material to support undergraduate teaching.

He runs the special study module in aesthetic restorative dentistry with Owen Addison.

He delivers postgraduate lectures and hands on courses to dentists, foundation year trainees, dental therapists, nurses and masters students (UCLAN) on a variety of subjects including direct and indirect restorative techniques, caries and minimal intervention dentistry.

He received the 2009 university of Birmingham award for teaching excellence.



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Course synopsis

Historically management of tooth wear involved crowning the worn teeth – A crazy way to treat already compromised teeth.

Improvement in the reliability of dentine adhesives over the past decade has allowed resin composite materials to be bonded to the worn surfaces, protecting them from further wear and restoring function and aesthetics.

This study day will discuss the theory of dentine bonding and the optimum materials and techniques to use when bonding composite to worn teeth, and will also discuss research into tooth shapes that are acceptable to patients.

In other words, worn teeth will have their appearance improved – they might not be perfect (as achieved by the ‘veneerologists’) but they are improved in a minimally invasive way – the concept of pragmatic aesthetics!

The programme will then use clinical examples to describe how to put theory into practice, demonstrating optimum ways of restoring function and aesthetics.

In the hands-on sessions, delegates will have the opportunity to practice restoring unaesthetic, fractured and worn anterior teeth, using state-of-the-art materials, equipment and techniques.
