Speaker 1:

John Rhodes: Specialist in Endodontics

John qualified from Kings College London in 1990, where he was awarded the Claudius Ash prize in Conservation and the Jose Souyave Endodontic prize. He continued his postgraduate education at Guy's Hospital London where he achieved a Distinction in the Endodontic MSc. He completed his Specialist training at The Royal College of Surgeons Edinburgh with MRD in Endodontics. John was awarded Fellowship in Dental Surgery from the Royal College of Edinburgh 2013 and is registered on the GDC Specialist list in Endodontics.

John lectures throughout the UK and contributes widely to postgraduate Endodontic teaching. He has published research papers in several refereed journals and numerous articles for dental press. He is co-author of the Endodontic textbook Endodontics: Problem Solving in Clinical Practice, Author of Advanced Endodontics: Re-treatment and Surgery and contributing Author in Harty's Endodontics in Clinical Practice. John is a referee for the International Endodontic Journal and ENDO (Endodontic Practice Today).

John runs The Endodontic Practice, a referral endodontic practice in Poole and Dorchester. He currently writes a monthly column Rhodes' Referrals in Dental Practice, provides Endodontic content for the Dental Channel and runs the Dorset Endo Study Group from the practice.

Serpil Djemal: Consultant in Restorative Dentistry

Serpil qualified at Kings in 1988 and in 2008 returned to King's College NHS Foundation Trust in Denmark Hill, SE London as a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry. She was previously a Consultant at Bart's and the London NHS Trust for 9 years.

In 2009, she took on the role of clinical lead for restorative dentistry and traumatology and is actively involved in the acute and long term management of patients who have sustained traumatic dental injuries.

She is founder chairperson to *Dental Trauma UK* a new charity set up to raise public and professional awareness in the prevention and management of traumatic dental injuries.
