Lloyd has been on the Forces cyber-crime working group for the past 3 years and more recently has been leading the project around Hampshire Polices future capability towards Digital and Cyber Crime.

Outside of work Lloyd completed an MSc in Risk Management last year, the topic of his dissertation being "The threat to small and medium enterprises posed by Social Network sites"

Chris Ward is the Technical Director at Vermont Systems, responsible for the delivery of services to clients. When he got his first computer in 1982 (A ZX Spectrum if you are interested) cyber crime wasn't a thing. Gaining a first class degree in Computer Science from Manchester University opened the door at IBM, and many years working with banks. Now his focus is on helping local businesses and charities to get the most out of technology.

Over recent years this has led him to become a cyber security expert, featuring recently as a guest on BBC Solent to discuss the subject. With cyber-crime so high up the agenda, much of his time is now spent advising clients on how to protect their business, training their staff to be vigilant and working in the community to raise awareness.
